

Frequently Asked Questions – LPC Full time

Does the LPC provide legal qualifications?

This course qualifies students to embark on a training contract to practise law as solicitors.

When does the LPC start?

There is one intake for the course in September.

What contact time is there in the LPC?

The course is taught over one year full time with teaching currently running from Monday through to Thursday most days.

How do I apply for the LPC (Full-time)?

Applications must be made via www.lawcabs.ac.uk

When do I apply for the LPC (Full-time)?

The first round opens in October and closes in December.

When will I hear about my LPC (Full-time) application?

First round decisions are made at the beginning of February (we cannot enter into discussions about offers until after this date).

Do you accept late applications for the LPC (Full-time)?

Applications can continue to be submitted but late applications will not be considered until the first offer round closes at the end of March.
We consider applications until mid August.

What degree do I need for the LPC?

Entry requirements are an LLB 2:2 or above or a GDL/CPE or a Senior Status.

How are applications considered?

Applications are assessed by the Admissions Tutor.

When do I need to apply for membership of the SRA?

Applicants must apply for student membership with the SRA by 1 April if they have any criminal convictions or character issues and 1 August if not.

Do I have to pay SRA membership fee?

Applicants must pay a fee to the SRA before enrolment, and once they have enrolled a further membership charge will be taken from their course fee.

When do I pay course fees or deposit?

A deposit is required once an offer is accepted.

As an NTU graduate am I eligible for a fee reduction?

A fee reduction of £500 is given to all NTU applicants who attend at Nottingham.
Conditions apply.

I graduated from a university outside of England - am I eligible to take the LPC?

All students who have studied for an LLB outside of England must check with the SRA that they are eligible to study the LPC (this sometimes affects Scotland and Ireland if they have not studied English Land Law).

Where can I study with Nottingham Law School?

The full-time course is offered at both Nottingham and Kaplan, London.
