New Assessment Builder Experience in NOW

Enhancement applied to the creation of new Assessments in NOW

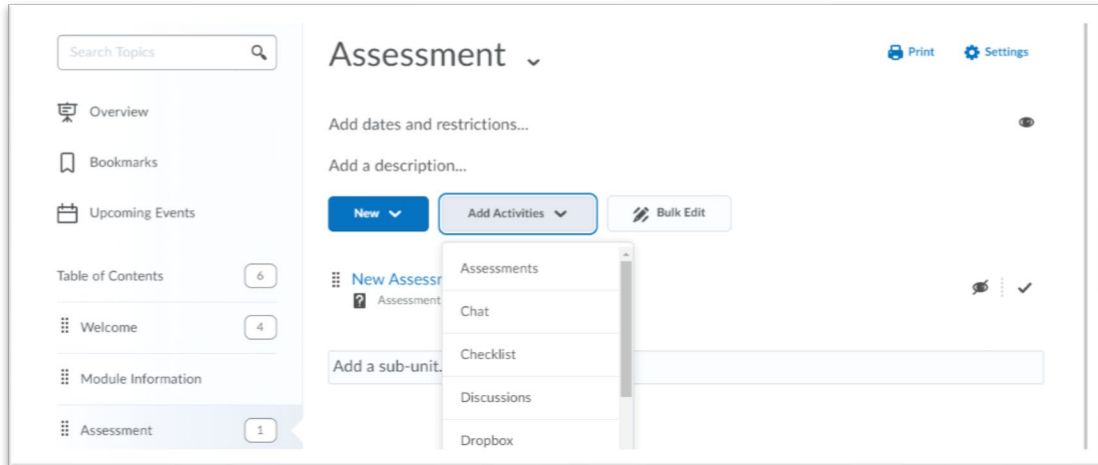
Overview

To simplify the creation of quizzes / assessments in NOW, an improved 'builder experience' has been rolled out.

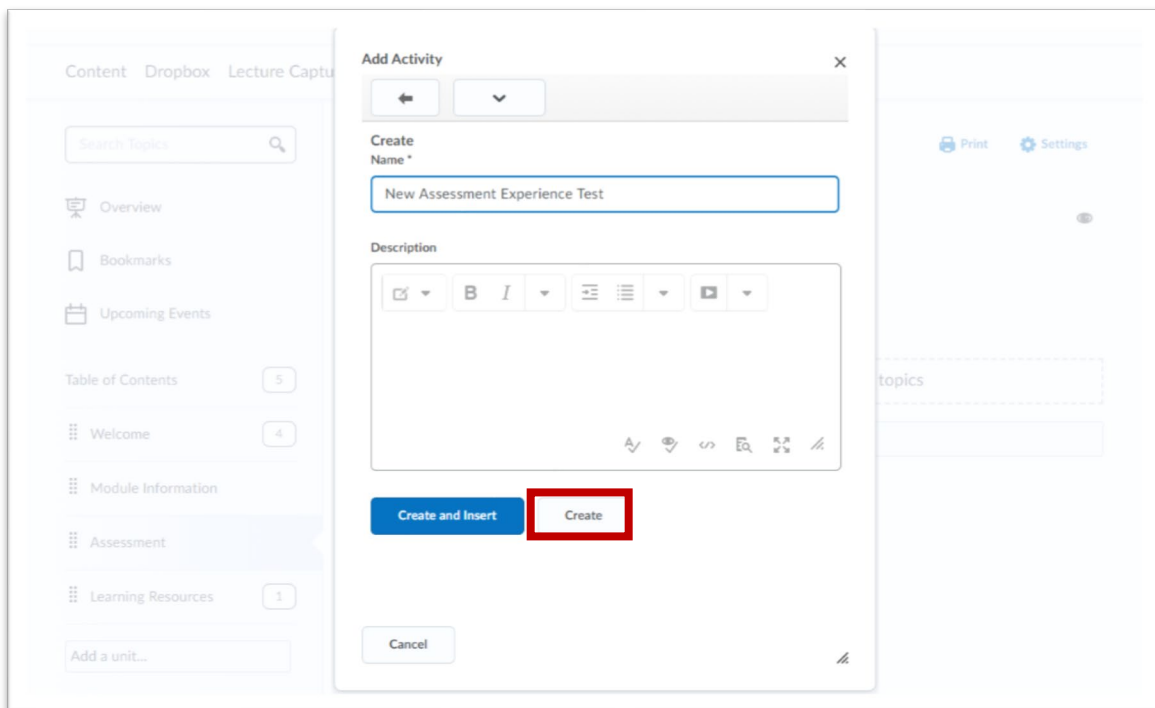
Enabling the new Assessment builder experience

The new user experience is enabled by default. However, to turn it on manually:

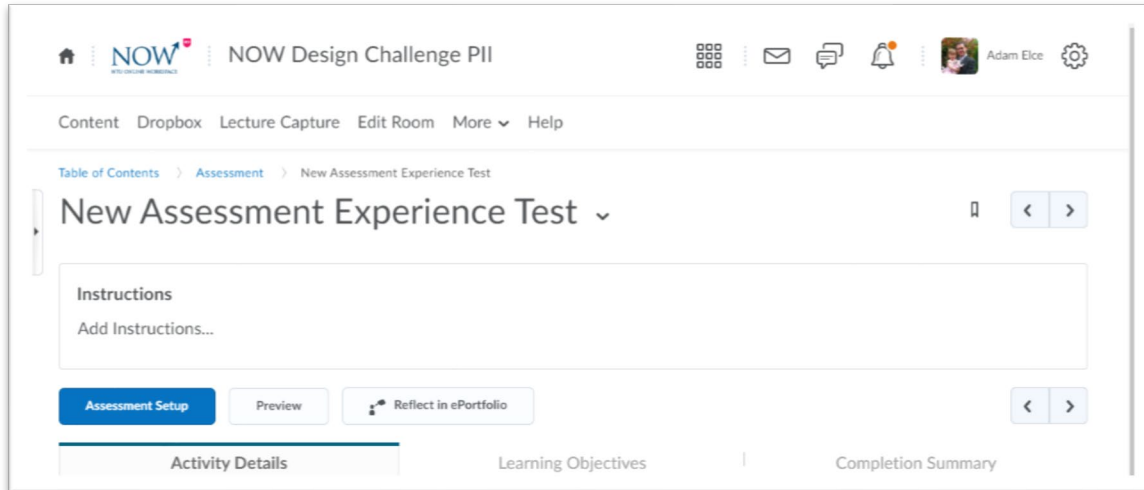
1. Navigate to the Content area of the Learning Room
2. Access a unit within the Learning Room where you wish to add an Assessment
3. Select **Assessments** from the **Add Activities** menu
4. Select a pre-created Assessment or click on **Create New Assessment**
5. If creating a new assessment, add a title and description and click **Create**.
6. On the next screen displayed, select **Assessment Setup**
7. Select the **Add/Edit Questions** button
8. If presented with an option to enable the new quiz [Assessment] building experience, select **Turn it on**. If not, select the button with an arrow as displayed below.



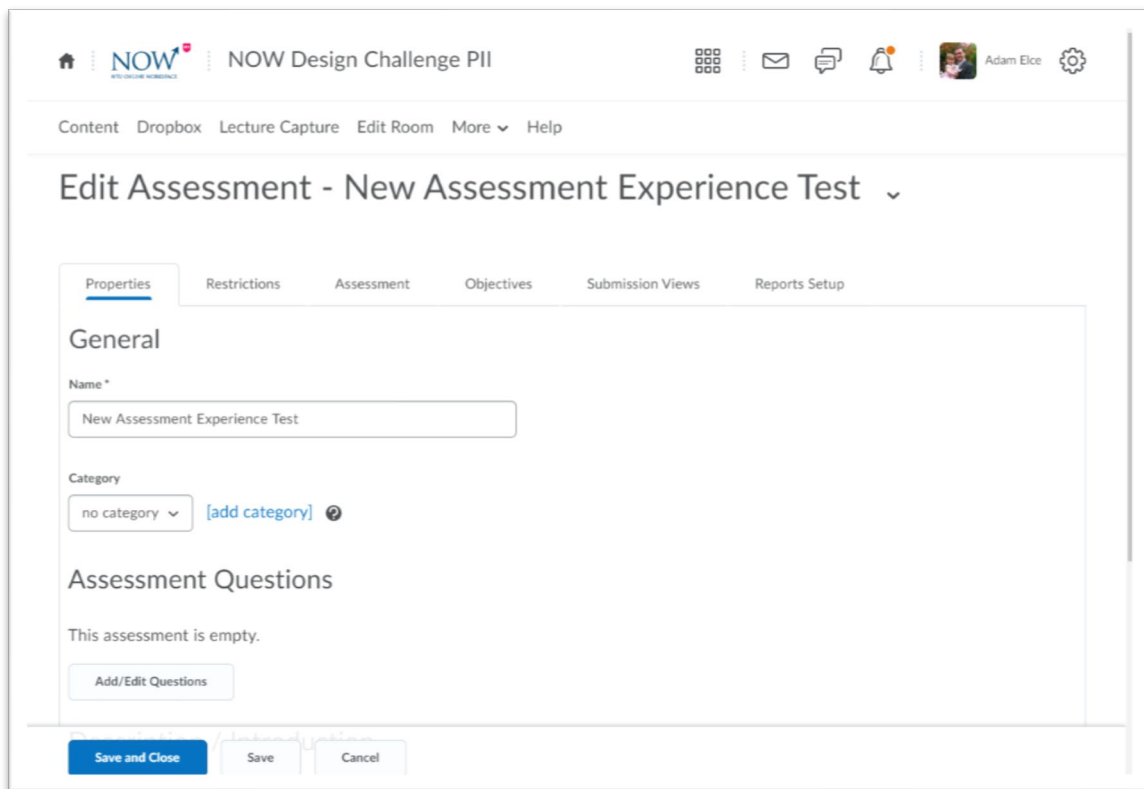
Add an Assessment from the **Add Activities** menu within the Content area of a Learning Room.



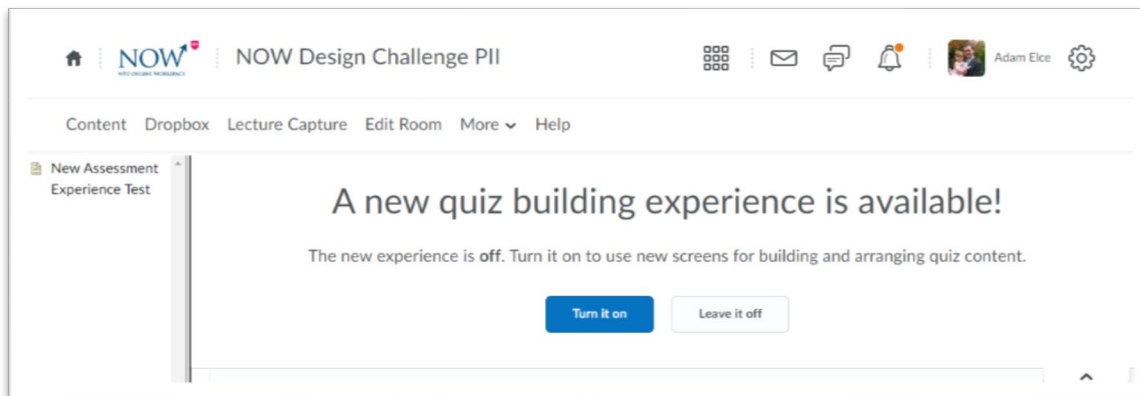
Add a title and description if necessary and select **Create**.



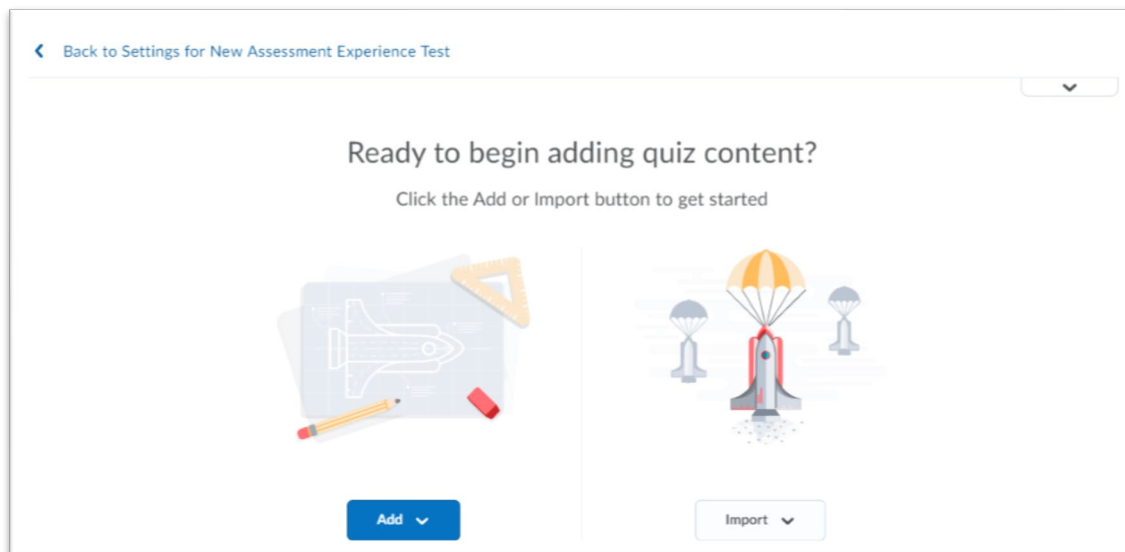
Select **Assessment Setup** to add questions and apply settings.



Select **Add/Edit Questions** to start building the quiz.



If presented with the option to enable the new experience, select **Turn it on**.

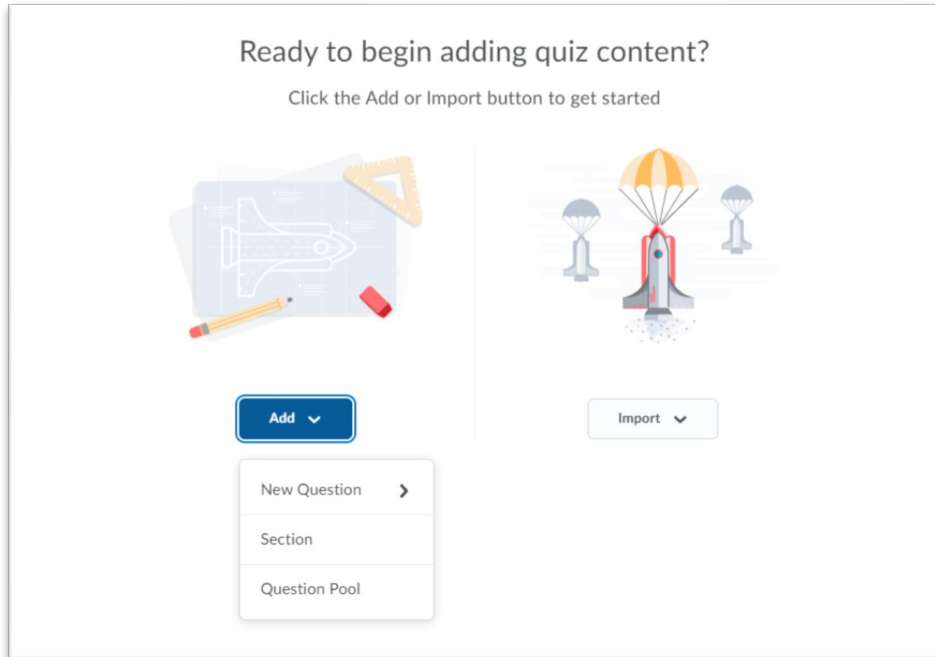


The new user experience is then presented.

Using the new experience to design the Assessment

With the new assessment builder experience enabled, use the **Add** option to begin. Questions can be created from scratch, picked from a pre-created Learning Room Question Library or uploaded from a file.

The remainder of this guide highlights the new quiz builder experience in action.



Use the **Add** option to insert new questions, create a section or build a Question Pool. Use **Import** to add questions from a file or existing Question Library.





The new experience provides a simplified interface for creating questions.
