# 2017

## March – September

Once you've settled on the right choice for you, you can start building a strong application with a great personal statement.

Received an offer from NTU?

That offer will be personal to you. Based on your predicted grades and current qualifications, it'll either be conditional (i.e. there are some requirements you'll need to meet – usually your exam results), or unconditional (i.e. we've offered you a place, pending some minor arrangements).

Make sure that you fully understand the details of your offer!
