



## NTU Estranged Student Covid Bursary 2020/21 Terms and Conditions

### 1. Introduction

- 1.1 Nottingham Trent University will be awarding a non-repayable NTU Estranged Student Covid Bursary to support full-time home undergraduate estranged students impacted by the Government's COVID-19 lockdown restrictions during the 2020/21 academic year.
- 1.2 The NTU Estranged Student Covid Bursary will be paid during the 2020/21 academic year only and recipients will receive a single cash award of £1000 in March 2021.

### 2. Eligibility

To be eligible for the NTU Estranged Student Covid Bursary, a student must, **on 16<sup>th</sup> March 2021**, meet all the following eligibility criteria:

- 2.1 Have been awarded a NTU Estranged Student Bursary for the 2020/21 academic year; AND
- 2.2 Be fully enrolled and attending their full-time undergraduate degree or foundation degree course (including remote learning)

### 3. Assessment, notification and payments

- 3.1 There is no separate application process for the NTU Estranged Student Covid Bursary. Bursaries will be allocated using information held by the University for those whose NTU Estranged Student Bursary was approved on or before 16<sup>th</sup> March 2021.
- 3.2 Students identified as eligible for the NTU Estranged Student Covid Bursary will receive an email from the University, confirming their eligibility for the bursary, followed by a notification letter, advising of the date of payment.
- 3.3 The NTU Estranged Student Covid Bursary will be paid in a single instalment directly into the student's bank account. Payment will be made by the Student Loans Company, on behalf of the University, using the account details supplied by the student to the Student Loans Company.
