


Clifton

The choice is yours

Choosing where you're going to live is a big decision – and it's really important to start your research early.

We asked two students what was most important to them...

"I've chosen to live in a single, privately-owned studio apartment so I have the personal space and alone-time to study. It's slightly more expensive but it's been worth it. All student accommodation comes with basic furniture and facilities, but because it's private some things I would have had to buy myself have been included – towels, bedding, a weekly cleaning service and even a hairdryer!

"It's really important to research your accommodation options. If you're going to share, look for students who are the same age range or studying at the same level as you. A postgraduate student would live very differently to a group of first-year undergraduates, for example.

"I feel really safe here as we have a 24-hour security guard. We have a lot of shared facilities such as a games room, a study room and even a small gym. Having everything in one place has allowed me to just concentrate on my studies."





Good to know

We have plenty of accommodation available, but if you're considering going private make sure to check our website. We only advertise UNIPOL accredited accommodation so you can be sure to find a good quality place that meets safety requirements.









"I decided to stay in University accommodation – halls – in my first year. I wanted to meet people and get involved in new activities and living in halls provided both of these opportunities. I first looked online. Included in the price was internet, all bills, free bus travel and contents insurance.

"The best thing about living in halls is how sociable it is. Some of the people you move in with will be your friends throughout your life at NTU. In halls there's always someone to talk to or relax with. It's like becoming part of a community when you move in. Don't be afraid to knock on your neighbour's door for a chat or join other people on nights out.

"Also, your room is somewhere you can escape to when you need some alone-time. Maybe playing a musical instrument, reading a book, or doing some other hobby that interests you."

Getting ready to study...


NTU style

Sitting in lectures all day, every day? Think again. Many of your studies will take place outside the lecture room. Studying at NTU may be very different to how you've studied before – our students tell us that it's probably their greatest challenge. They also tell us that it can be the most rewarding and empowering part of their student experience...



Seminars

These take place in small, informal groups. They're a chance for you to talk about the subject in more detail with the lecturer and some of your classmates, ask any questions and do problem-solving activities.



Independent study

You'll have 'free' time on your timetable – this is when you must do your own research. Whether you study at home, in the library or in a café, it's your time to reflect on your subject and grow in confidence.



Group project work

You'll work in small groups on a task or project. Depending on your subject, you'll be in laboratories, workshops or studios where you'll be using specialist equipment. You may even be working with external agencies and companies.

"The course structure here is very different to what I'm used to. You're taught to be more independent, creative and critical. You're expected to do your own research and make your own conclusions.

"I didn't know I'd enjoy this way of studying but it has given me a whole new attitude. I've improved so much. My friends are surprised how much time I spend in the library!

"Each module on the course is taught separately. You study a subject intensely for around a month, you're assessed on it and then you move to the next. I like this style of learning.

"Also, the lecturers are so engaging here. They've opened my mind to new ways of thinking and they challenge me — which I like!"

There are so many social activities and events happening at the University throughout the year where you can truly cross cultures and make lifelong friends from all over the world.


