

## **NTU Global Summer School Course Description**

### **Sports Journalism**

Credit points: 5 (2.5 ECTS)

Duration: 5 days

This course is intended for people who are new to sports journalism. To benefit from the course you should have the required <u>English language skills</u>.

#### **Overview and aims**

Nottingham is the home of Trent Bridge Cricket Ground, the Panthers Ice Hockey Team, the National Water Sports Centre and is the official City of Football for the UK. Where better to learn the craft of sports journalism?

This course will give you an insight into the different forms of sports journalism. You will learn how to write scripts for multimedia, including match reports and sports features. The way sports reporting uses social media and blogs will be explored, along with the art of commentary for radio and television.

By the end of the course you'll have a good understanding of how to construct multi-media sports stories.

On this course you will:

- explore social media and sports blogs
- learn interview techniques in the studio and on location
- construct and write sports features
- experience how a sports journalist works.
