NTU Care Leaver Bursary

for students commencing a course at Nottingham Trent University in 2019/2020

Nottingham Trent University will be awarding a Care Leaver Bursary of £500 to eligible full-time undergraduates who commence their studies at Nottingham Trent University in 2019.

Am I eligible?

You should be eligible to receive the Care Leaver Bursary if you meet ALL of the following criteria:

- You have been in the care of a local authority in the UK (or have been looked after by relatives who have a court order to look after you in the UK) at some point since the age of 16; and
- You are under the age of 25 in the year you are assessed for the bursary; and
- You are enrolled on a full-time undergraduate degree course or foundation degree course.

You do not have to repay the bursary and you will be eligible regardless of your household income.

How much will I receive?

The Care Leaver Bursary is a £500 cash award, paid directly into your bank account, to supplement living costs and is paid for each year of your course.

How do I apply?

If you meet all the eligibility criteria listed above, you can apply for the NTU care Leaver Bursary.

To apply, you will need to email <u>careleaverbursary@ntu.ac.uk</u> and you will be sent a link to our online application form.

This short online form will capture some basic information about you, your studies at NTU and your time spent in care. The application process will not require you to disclose anything about the circumstances surrounding your time in care. You are, however, asked to provide evidence of your time in care. Please email your evidence to financial.support@ntu.ac.uk. When emailing your evidence of time in care, please type 'Care Leaver Bursary Evidence' in the subject line of your email.

When should I apply?

You can apply as soon as you have a firm unconditional or conditional offer of a place at Nottingham Trent University, We would urge you to **apply no later than 6 September 2019** so we can make all the necessary arrangements to help your transition into NTU.

If you miss this deadline you can still apply up until the end of July 2020, but we would urge you to apply early so you can access important advice and information to help make your transition to studying at Nottingham Trent University as seamless as possible.

If I apply, who will my information be shared with?

NTU Care Leaver Bursary applications are only seen by staff with the Department of Student Support Services who are involved with the administration of the NTU Care Leaver Bursary scheme and dedicated Student Support Staff who offer transition support to Care Leavers.

What happens next?

On receipt of your application, your eligibility for the Bursary will be assessed and a member of the Student Financial Support team will contact you to advise you of the outcome of your application (or to request additional information if necessary) If you are eligible for a Care Leaver bursary, you will receive written confirmation of your Bursary entitlement and details of the bursary payment arrangements. You will also be contacted by a member of the Student Support Services team to arrange a meeting to discuss the help available to support your transition to University.

Please note, Bursary payments will not be released until the Bursary recipient is fully enrolled on their course.

How and when is the money paid?

The bursary will be split into two equal instalments of £250 payable on the following dates:

13 November 2019

26 February 2020

Payment dates will, in some cases, be affected by the date the application is received and assessed and when you have met with a member of the Student Support Services team to discuss transition support.

The NTU Care Leaver bursary will be paid directly into the student's bank account. Payment will usually be made by SLC, on behalf of the University, using the account details supplied by the student to the Student Loans Company. Payment will be made directly to the student by the University if a student is not in receipt of Student Finance from the Student Loans Company.

What if I am not sure I am eligible?
