

Chris Whomersley was formerly a Deputy Legal Adviser in the United Kingdom's Foreign & Commonwealth Office, his career spanning thirty-six years and covering many areas of international law. Chris spent a number of years dealing with aviation issues, and he was involved in the Channel Tunnel project since its inception. For the last ten years of his time in the Foreign Office, he was responsible for policy on international law of the sea. This included dealing with these issues both multilaterally and bilaterally, as well as in the European Union. He led the United Kingdom delegations in a number of bilateral negotiations on maritime delimitation. He was also the leader of the UK delegation to the International Seabed Authority, and was a member of its Finance Committee. He was responsible for the arrangements relating to the declaration of an Exclusive Economic Zone around the United Kingdom, as well as for the law updating UK legislation on deep sea mining. In June 2014 Chris was honoured by HM The Queen for his services to international law.
