

Practice Educator Two

Credits from this 30 credit module can be put towards a PG Cert Social Work Practice Education, a PG Cert/PG Dip Advanced Social Work Practice or the MA Advanced Social Work Practice. Applications are open to all registered social workers with two years Post Qualified experience.

Introduction

Teaching is delivered through lectures, seminars, group work along with pre-teaching reading. Delivery is usually at the City campus and is supported by a range of online learning materials and access to library resources for personal study.

Overview and Aims

- This module aims to enable graduates to meet the requirements for Practice Educator Two as set out in Practice Educator Professional Standards (PEPS). To complete Practice Educator Two you will need to have, and provide evidence of, successfully completing Practice Educator One. An explorative look at students journey through placement

The module supports Practice Educators in ensuring that the knowledge, skills and values on which they base their own practice and on which they teach, supervise and assess learners are in line with current professional expectations.

Module Content

Students will already have an underpinning knowledge of adult learning theories, different learning styles, learning of social work theory and practice, and the role of the supervisor/ mentor in giving and receiving feedback, according to domain D of the Practice Educator Professional Standards for Social Work.

This module will build on Practice Educator One and incorporate the additional demands of domain B12, C15 and 16 and domain D:

- An explorative look at the student's journey through placement, reflections from PE 1 and the learning taken from this experience
- Supervision of a second student and completion of full practice report.
- Exploring a range of supervision models
- Involvement in Quality Assurance in Practice Learning process.
- Exploring teaching and assessment methods and approaches
- Managing complexities and challenges
- Reflection on and evaluation of own practice
- Demonstrate the application of different methods of learning and development
- Maintain own professional development.

Teaching

Teaching is primarily delivered online through lectures, class discussions, group work activities, assignment surgeries, research and critical reflection. However, there may be occasions, for the purposes of supporting the programme of teaching when students will need to attend in person.

Delivery is also supported by a range of online learning materials and access to library resources for personal study.

Assessment

You will need to be able to take on the role of Practice Educator during the course of study.

The overall assessment will include:

- Observation of Practice Educator stage two activities to the required standard by Practice Mentor Assessor (PMA)
- Practice curriculum report being accepted after placement.
- Verification of practice by agency
- Reflective assignment on practice education at stage two.
- Completion of the University Quality Assurance documentation
- Attendance and participation all teaching days

Fees

The modular fee for academic year 2021/22 is £550.
