Continuous Professional Development (CPD) Courses
for Qualified Social Workers



Guidance notes for applicants

Candidates wishing to undertake Continuous Professional Development (CPD) courses for qualified social workers (or equivalent) should:

- hold a professional social work qualification (or equivalent);
- be a registered social worker with the Health and Care Professions Council (HCPC) (or equivalent professional body); and
- meet the course requirements for the CPD module applied for.

In addition, candidates should:

- have the support of their line manager and agency (unless they are an independent candidate);
- be able to sustain a high level of self-motivation over time and be available to attend taught study days and workshops;
- be able to manage the demands of balancing work and study;
- produce written work of a high standard in terms of presentation and analytical / reflective content; and
- ensure fees will be paid by their agency or other source e.g. the candidate. No qualification can be awarded if fees are not paid.

Candidates who are sponsored by their agency will need to ensure they have agency support before submitting an application.

All candidates, both funded or self-funded, are asked to send an **electronic copy** of this completed application form, with an accompanying sponsorship letter to **SOC.CPD@ntu.ac.uk**

Candidates who would like to undertake multiple modules simultaneously should contact the course team to discuss their options.
