The ideal candidate will be a published or performed writer with experience of leading workshops or creative sessions. You'll be confident and curious and enthusiastic to make the most of this opportunity – which you will have freedom to shape.

The culmination of the residency will be a commission to create a piece of spoken word to feature in our graduation celebrations.

This residency will contribute to Curated & Created, NTU's extra-curricular cultural programme which includes Bonington Gallery, NTU Music, and our new performance venue, Metronome.
