### Your digital portfolio is the perfect opportunity to showcase your work, skills and interests.

This is your chance to demonstrate your passion as well as your creativity and your individual approach to interior architecture and design.

We understand your digital portfolio is unique to you as a creative individual, but here's a handy checklist of things you need, and things you should consider.

#### What you need to include:

Between 10 - 20 slides on a range of subjects and in different media.

An outline of what your favourite building is, or an interior space that inspires you. This can be a simple statement.

#### This may consist of:

Sketching and hand drawing.

Photography.

Images of your 2D work. This can be in a variety of mediums including paint or charcoal by hand and / or by computer-aided design (CAD) software.

A demonstrated interest in 3D design and images of your 3D work. Work could include sculpture, model- making craft work and product design.

#### What are we looking for in your digital portfolio?

- Your understanding of the creative design process.
- A quality and range of techniques demonstrated.
- An ability to handle a variety of media, technologies and processes.
- A willingness to experiment, raise questions and develop ideas through the creative use of a variety of media and working methods.
- Your observational and interpretive skills applied to spatial and 3D forms.



#### Our assessment of your work will consider:

- Innovation and creativity.
- Your passion for interior architecture and design, and your curiosity and willingness to interact and engage.
- Interest in relevant areas of design, interior architecture, spatial design and architecture.
- Your ability to work individually, independently, self-directed, and as part of a team.

#### Please submit your practical work as a PDF.

The maximum file size of 10 megabytes (mb) or a single unzipped file not exceeding 10 mb.
