JOB PURPOSE: To support with university outreach activities and events delivered by the Centre for Student and Community Engagement. An Outreach Ambassador is a paid, flexible role representing the university to support and engage with young people about your experience as a student.

PRINCIPAL DUTIES AND RESPONSIBILITIES:

- 1. To provide support to university staff, classroom teachers and pastoral staff, in school and on campus.
- 2. To deliver short presentations to pupils and parents on a variety of themes associated with student life.
- 3. Lead group activities, campus tours and share your educational journey to inspire young people.
- 4. Provide further information about university life, to help raise pupils' self-esteem, motivation, confidence, persistence and application, through the successful completion of prepared activities.
- 5. To help pupils to see the connection between the studies in which they are currently engaged and the future stages in their development.
- 6. To act as a positive role model to pupils, particularly in relation to Higher Education.
- 7. To participate actively in all sessions and activities, which could also include those delivered to NTU students as part of NTU Welcome and other programmes.
- 8. To act responsibly and appropriately when working with pupils, their parents, teachers and NTU students and staff.
- 9. To work collaboratively with CenSCE colleagues and other Outreach Ambassadors to provide feedback and share best practice (including attendance of training, review and evaluation meetings).
- 10. Assist with the setup, pack down, clearing and tidying of venues once activities are over.
- 11. To attend all training sessions associated with the post.
- 12. Undertake any other reasonable duties as requested within the scope of the post.

ADDITONAL INFORMATION:

- Transport to all events and activities external to NTU will be provided, unless otherwise stated.
- This role will include the opportunity to work outside of university term time.



SPECIAL REQUIREMENTS:

• All applicants must have no spent or current convictions relating to children and must be willing to

undergo an Enhanced Disclosure and Barring Scheme (DBS) application with satisfactory results.

Applicants must agree to this information being shared with partner schools.

- Two references are required prior to starting work.
- You must be available to work a minimum of three shifts within a 12-month period and attend all training sessions required for the role.
