You can also take a tram – simply board at the Nottingham Trent University stop outside Boots Library (map ref. **L**) and get off at one of the following stops:

(three stops)
-  **Nottingham Station**
(four stops)

Travelling between campuses

City to Clifton Campus:

Board the NCT number 1 bus from the stop at Nottingham Beastmarket Hill (B2) in Old Market Square. Show your open day guide or event booking confirmation email to access this free bus service. All visitors attending the open day can travel for free.

City to Confetti Campus:

Board the free shuttle bus located outside of the Dryden building (Map ref. **D**). Alternatively, Confetti Campus is a 10-minute walk from the Newton building. Head to Convent Street (NG1 3LL) and pass key city locations along the way, including the Victoria Centre.

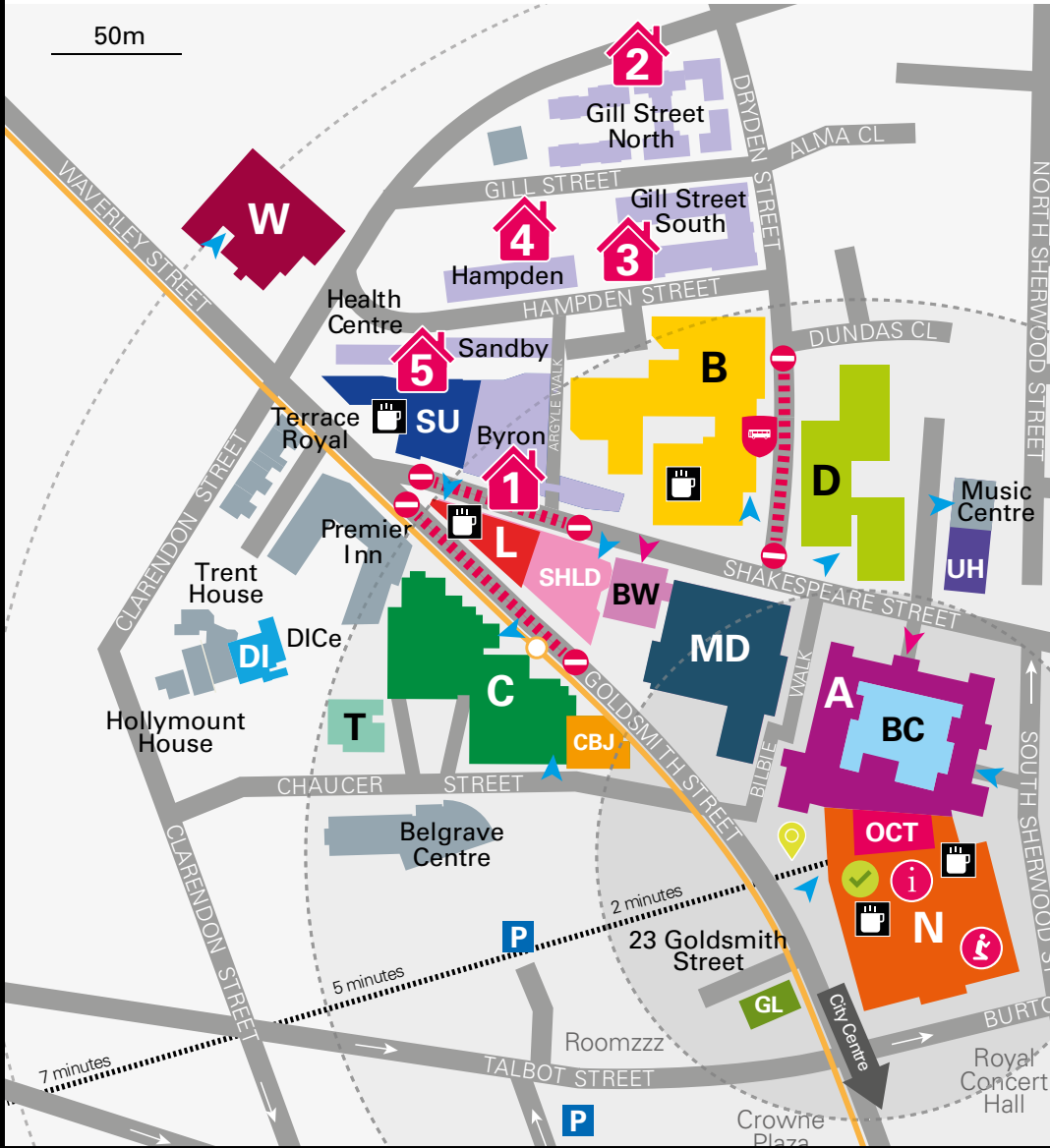
