

Publishing from your eThesis

A common copyright concern for research students is that you will not be able to reuse the material from your thesis in a journal article or book once it has been made publicly available in the institutional repository ([IRep](#)).

This is not an issue for the majority of publishers as they don't consider a thesis to be a publication for this purpose. This is particularly true for peer-reviewed journals, as you won't be submitting your complete thesis for journal publication. The content of the section you submit is likely to be reworked and revised through the peer review and editorial processes if it's accepted, so the finished article is normally significantly different from the original thesis text. You should always seek editorial advice from your publisher to confirm that thesis material is not excluded from consideration.

Book publishers are more likely to consider your thesis as a published work but the majority still do not have concerns that depositing your thesis in an open access repository will harm potential book sales. The editorial process is likely to result in substantial changes to your content, so producing a new publication. Again, you will need to discuss this with potential publishers.
