Has the pandemic resulted in any positives and / or long-lasting changes in your community?

The pandemic has influenced almost all the spheres of our lives. Though it has lasted for a relatively short historical period, its impact on the society is difficult to overestimate. They are also more aware of health conditions in employees. I don't believe it will be entirely long-lasting as once the economy reaches a more stable status the need for more staff with an increasing sales rate or workload will be necessary.
