



### **Overview of the TILT Student Co-Creation Fund**

The Trent Institute for Learning and Teaching (TILT) supports projects to enhance learning and teaching at NTU. The Student Co-Creation Fund is intended to provide students (in partnership with a member of staff) with a small amount of funding (up to £750) for projects focussing on learning and teaching. Students can apply for funding as a team (up to 5 including staff member).

### Application process

**Step 1:** If you have an idea for a project and would like to talk this through with a member of the TILT Team then we offer an initial conversation to discuss your idea before completing the full application. Please email <u>tilt@ntu.ac.uk</u> with a short description of your idea and to arrange a 1:1 meeting. Please note you do not need to complete Step 1. You can move straight to Step 2 if you are ready to go with your idea!

**Step 2:** Complete the full application online - The TILT Student Co-Creation Fund Application Form is <u>available here</u> as an MS Form. You are welcome to include links to a video application or any visual artefacts/images that will support your application.

A full list of the questions on the MS form are available below if you would like to prepare them offline then upload to the MS form. As a guide we suggest no more than 500 words per section.

- Sell your project in a few sentences (this is your elevator pitch/short abstract).
- Tell us about your idea:
  - What are you planning to do and why?
  - How does it link to learning and teaching?
  - What will be the primary output?
- Tell us about the project itself:
  - Who will work on the project and when?
  - How much money do you think you need and what will it be spent on?
- Post Project

- When the project is finished, how will you tell others about it?
- Will it be beneficial just to NTU or might it be helpful to other Universities?

- Do you think this project will benefit your own experience of learning and teaching or be useful to you in your future career or lifewide learning experience?

- Please tell us how this project will benefit the professional development journey of your co-applicants (Staff Member)?

## Support Available

Drop-in sessions and 1:1 appointments will be available to book with a member of the TILT team in order to discuss any aspect of the application process or form.

### Number of awards available

TILT is offering up to four awards each financial year, to be considered in one application round.

Awards will be made on a competitive basis and assessed against the review criteria below.

### Eligibility to apply

- Students must be in their second year of study or later.
- Students must be 'in good standing', by which we mean that undertaking the proposed project must not be deemed to potentially have a detrimental effect on their studies. This will be checked by the relevant Personal Tutor / Course Leader.
- Co-Applicants can be any member of NTU Academic and Professional Services staff.
- Co-Applicants must have the approval of their Line Managers.
- Co-Applicants are expected to hold or be demonstrably working towards Fellowship Higher Education Academy status.

# **Eligible Activities**

Funding may be requested for the following activities:

- Support new or existing learning and teaching projects, for example by funding incentives for participation (subject to ethical approval);
- Purchase/hire resources, materials or equipment to use in a learning and teaching innovation or a scholarship project (where these are not already available within NTU);
- Support evaluation or expansion of an enhancement in learning and teaching / innovation which has been piloted or initially adopted; and / or

• Support an initial project that will serve as a 'proof of concept'

### Outputs

Proposals should include at least one specific output with demonstrable potential to enhance / advance an aspect of learning and teaching NTU.

Please note, outputs are defined as:

- 1. Learning Resources
- 2. Publications
- 3. Events (including presentations, seminars, networks, workshops and conferences)
- 4. Reports
- 5. Digital Content (including TILTOnline and TILT webpages)
- 6. Other outputs that cannot be categorised as 1 5, e.g. Course / Module (re)design or physical artefact/space.

#### Ethics

Applications must demonstrate full consideration of all ethical issues involved in the project. This may include identifying the ethical issues, the steps taken to manage / mitigate any risks, and any formal processes undertaken to achieve NTU institutional ethical approval (if required) and the outcome.

#### **Conditions of Award**

Successful applicants will be required to agree with the Conditions of Award.

#### **Review Process**

Your application will be reviewed by a panel which will include NTU staff and students. The panel will review your responses to the questions and allocate scores as below:

#### Review criteria are equally weighted and assessed on a scale of 1-5:

- 1. no evidence
- 2. little evidence
- 3. some evidence
- 4. good evidence
- 5. excellent evidence
