Our students have gone on to work for:

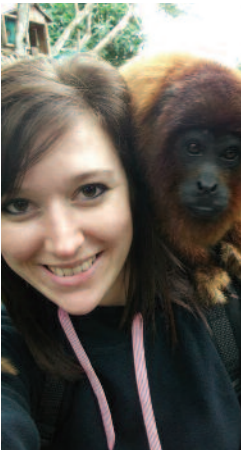
- veterinary practices
