

NTU Outreach opportunities for Nottingham and Nottinghamshire schools 2024-25

Centre for Student and Community Engagement Nottingham Trent University are pleased to present our outreach offer to you. This document outlines the learner journey from primary to secondary school and is designed for you to display it on your wall and easily share with your colleagues.

NTU is committed to social mobility.

Our outreach programmes are underpinned by research and evaluation. NTU findings indicate that pupils who participate in multiple outreach activities are more likely to apply to, and progress in higher education. We prioritise working with Free School Meals (FSM) cohorts because of the considerable gap in higher education participation rates between pupils who are eligible and those who are not.

Our work is targeted within Nottingham City and Nottinghamshire, predominantly in areas with lower progression to higher education.

NTU is required by the Office for Students (OfS) to regularly report our progress. To help us measure the impact of our activities, we appreciate your support in collecting data from pupils and parents/carers.

Data information

Why do we collect pupil data?

NTU is required by our regulator the OfS to promote widening participation and regularly report our progress. By collecting and tracking pupil data through the Higher Education Access Tracker (HEAT), we can monitor the impact of our outreach activities.

What data is collected?

The data collected includes parents/carers and pupil details. There is an option to select 'prefer not to say' to some questions.

How is data collected?

Before delivering any outreach activities we will ask schools to share data information forms with parents/carers to complete. This can be done digitally or using paper forms. NTU staff may also collect a register at the start of activities. This will include pupils' names and postcode so we can then identify if a pupil has an existing record on the HEAT database.

How is data stored?

Nottingham Trent University is compliant with GDPR. All data information forms and registers will be securely stored until the end of the academic year plus one year, then securely destroyed.

The role of the school in data collection

We appreciate your support to distribute and return completed data information forms. Schools must ensure any completed paper forms are returned to NTU staff on the day of the activities.

Primary Programme overview

The primary outreach programme introduces pupils to the concept of university. Pupils will develop key vocabulary linked to university and gain an understanding of the journey from

primary school through to higher education. All our primary activities involve NTU students to answer pupils' questions. Outreach is most effective when it is sustained and progressive, so we'd love to see your pupils every year.

Year 5 Discovering university workshop

This workshop introduces the concept and purpose of university. Pupils can discuss course options and find out about what university students can get involved in outside of lessons. NTU students will be available to answer questions.

Secondary overview

For 2024-25 we have a new format for our secondary outreach programme that we are excited to share with you. We now have the option for you to book assemblies for all pupils in years 7-11. All assemblies are

followed by a workshop exclusively for your Free School Meal (FSM) pupils. These workshops will develop and build on the knowledge gained in the assembly. All assemblies must be delivered prior to the follow-on workshops.

The programme will provide pupils with an opportunity to access information about higher education and explore the journey from secondary school to university. Pupils will look at the skills needed for progression into post-16 learning and consider future education pathways. Outreach is most effective when it is sustained and progressive, so we'd love to see your pupils every year.


Whole year
