

Our students also love the many independent vintage and charity shops in Nottingham's Creative Quarter.


Arts, culture and heritage





Settling into a new country involves going through many changes – environment, climate, food, and culture. It's important that you take care of your health and wellbeing and we are here to support you every step of the way.

As a student at NTU, you'll have access to a huge range of support for your wellbeing, including:

LIVING COSTS AND BUDGETING

Living in Nottingham as a student is cheaper than in bigger UK cities, such as Manchester, Birmingham, or London. Still, it's really important that you are well-prepared and budget carefully. It isn't just your fees you will need to pay; you will have immediate costs when you arrive, and daily, weekly, and monthly expenses too.

How much you spend depends on your own lifestyle and you may find that the cost of goods and services in the UK is quite different to your own country. Here is an approximate guide to what you can expect to pay as a student at NTU.



Budgeting

There are many ways to save money while you're here – using your student card for discounts in shops and on transport, for example.

Your daily, weekly and monthly costs will mostly be for your accommodation, food, entertainment and bills. There's lots of advice on budgeting and discounts on our website - take a look!



Approximate costs of studying in Nottingham per month:

 Accommodation: (NTU or private)	£580 - £1,250
 Groceries from supermarket:	£144 - £200
 Socialising (eating out with friends):	£66
 Travel:	£69
 Clothes:	£48
 Gym membership:	£26
 Course materials (books):	£24

You need to plan for the visa application financial requirements. From 2 January 2025, this will rise from £1,023 to £1,136 per month (and from £1,334 to £1,483 per month for London).


