Homelessness and Substance Misuse: multi-discipline interventions - 10cps

Overview:

This course will focus on how people working in health and social care, and related areas can effectively support individuals and communities affected by homelessness and substance misuse.

Emphasis will be placed on the importance of multi-disciplinary working, and how "joined-up" approaches between different professionals can deliver better outcomes for these vulnerable groups.

Students will have the opportunity to demonstrate their new skills and knowledge in a group presentation at the end of the course.

Content:

- Introduction to multi-disciplinary working and key principles.
- Reflection and discussion on key issues which may lead to homelessness and substance misuse.
- Opportunities for students to collaborate and complete tasks in smaller groups.
- Visits to services in Nottingham providing support to people experiencing homelessness and/or substance misuse.
- Guest speakers who have experience and expertise in this field.
- Opportunities to speak with people who have lived experience of homelessness and/or substance misuse.

This course is perfect for students on a related degree who have an interest in this area. Prior knowledge on the specific topics would be useful but not essential.
