COURSES

This section includes a full listing of NTU's undergraduate courses. It's organised by subject area, providing course titles and qualifications, UCAS codes, typical entry requirements, length and modes of study, campus locations, and the courses' key features.

Titles and qualifications

- Typically, bachelor-level degrees are BA (Hons) or BSc (Hons).
- Some courses have a qualification title that's related to the specific subject area (e.g., BEng, BArch, or LLB). Other higher education qualifications include CertHE, HND, and HNC.
- If the course requires a year of study before the degree, it'll be labelled with 'foundation year'.
- Where the qualification starts with an 'M' (e.g., MCHEM) this is a Masters-level qualification.

Typical entry requirements

- If you're applying for an honours degree or a course with a foundation year, you'll usually need to be studying three A-levels. or equivalent qualifications (i.e. BTECs).
- We display entry requirements as UCAS Tariff points, either as a specific total (e.g., 64) or a range (e.g., 112-120). That range means you could be accepted to the same course based on slightly different points, as we consider each application individually and use different factors to build 'contextual' offers.
- · We've also highlighted where some courses require a specific qualification, such as an A-level in a particular subject.



Wondering what grades equate to what points?

Accredited — this course is accredited by a professional body, institute, or company linked to the subject, recognising its standards of teaching and learning.



Study abroad — this course includes studying or working abroad at one of our international partner universities.



Work placements — the course either involves a short placement (non-award-bearing, or with a placement certificate), or a sandwich year (a paid placement over one academic year, usually completed in your third year of study).



Contextual offer available — a tailored offer is available, based on vour personal circumstances. See page 57 for more information on contextual offers.

AND FUNDING

At the time of publication, the fees and funding arrangements for 2025 entry at NTU haven't been confirmed. In the meantime, keep an eye on the useful links to get all the help and information you need.

As a general guide, here are NTU's tuition fees for 2024 entry:

Home fees

- Full-time undergraduate and foundation degrees £9,250 per year
- A placement year as part of a sandwich degree - £1,850 per year
- An academic year spent studying or working abroad - £1,385 per year

International fees

- £17,900 per year for courses in the Nottingham School of Art & Design, and Nottingham Business School
- £17.150 per year for all other subjects
- £17,400 per year for courses based at Confetti London
